

Materials


- Oil pastels
- Black tempera paint
- Paint brushes
- Cardstock
- Bobby pins or toothpicks

Directions

- 1. Color the entire piece of card stock with all different colors of oil pastels.
- 2. Paint over the oil pastel colors with black tempera paint.
- 3. Let the paint dry completely. If it's at all still wet, the paper will peel when you try to scratch the paint off.
- Use a bobby pin or toothpick and begin to scratch a positive word or sentence into the paint. The paint should easily come off and the colors will be revealed below.
